## GPG Featured Youth– Darrell “DJ” Jones

We are speechless and beyond grateful when we reflect on prayers made 18 years ago for our son Daryl Terrell Jones, Jr. (a.k.a. DJ). God answered every prayer. Every night we whispered the prayer given to us by a Spiritual Mother in our church True Vine, Des Moines, Iowa. The prayer simply stated, “Lord, give us a son, strong in mind, strong in body with a heart turned toward You”. We had no idea what we were really asking for.

**Strong of Body:** The Lord blessed us on April 17, 1994 with a 7lb 8oz baby boy. The one thing that I remember Dr. McInnis, the pediatrician, saying after the delivery was, “Your son has a beautiful disposition, we are doing all kinds of stuff to him and he is not crying”. He also asked if either of us were double jointed because his body structure was flexible and muscular and he had 2 unique thumbs. His physical strength has allowed D.J. to run for over 1,000 yards on the football field and score many touchdowns. He was selected as the male candidate for the Lindy Callahan Scholarship for Callaway High School and

received the designation as the male winner of the Wendy’s Heisman Award for Callaway High School. He will receive a scholarship from Texas Southern University based on his athletic ability.

**Strong of Mind:** DJ was always inquisitive about things. Being a stay home mom, and dad, a full time college student, the Lord provided an opportunity for him to be nurtured and taught in his way every minute of every day. As a result, he accepted Christ at an early age. He also learned to read at a very early age. We would spend hours in my classroom (my closet) learning basic things in reading and math. I thank God for the insight to provide that for him. As a result of this blessing he accepted the challenge of a more rigorous curriculum by taking every honor or accelerated course offered. He is one of Callaway High School’s 2012 top 10 Graduates, Member of Mu Alpha Theta, The National Honor Society, Student Government Association, elected to serve as a Boy’s State Delegate, and will receive academic scholarship money as a result of his performance on the ACT and in the classroom.

**Heart Turned Toward God:** An excerpt from a journal I am keeping for DJ says, “It was May 12, 1998 and we fell asleep without praying. At 3 a.m. DJ woke up and said to me, “Mama we forgot to pray”. DJ has always had God’s ear. In early 1998, he began asking a lot of questions about salvation and asked me what he needed to do to go to heaven. I explained it to him and the next Sunday he told Pastor Willis Washington that he wanted to be saved. I had no doubt that he understood exactly what he was asking for. To this day his faith has never wavered. In late 1999 he began asking us for a sister to which we responded, “That blessing would be up to God and that he needed to pray for a sister”. He began praying and sure enough a beautiful Princess (Alea) joined our family in 1999. What an awesome example he has been for her.

Another big answer to prayer that comes to mind is football. In 9th grade DJ was not content with his football team. He felt they could be bigger, better, stronger. He even stated that he wished his father could coach him and all his friends. I know he prayed because by his 10th grade year, the Lord blessed his father with a football coaching position at Callaway High School (The Lord, gave us a whole team for DJ). Now, I am watching another miracle unfold for him as he begins his college career and desire to major in Engineering and continue playing the game of football. Guess what? God has already handled that as well, DJ’s high school football coach (Coach Tillman) recently accepted a job at Texas Southern University and has recruited DJ to be a member of the team, **“WHAT AN AWESOME GOD WE SERVE”**. If he doesn’t like it or never plays a down, it is still evidence of what having your heart turned toward **HIM** can do for you. By the way, I forgot to mention that DJ plans to major in Civil Engineering and Texas Southern will offer Civil Engineering for the first time this fall. If you were not a believer before now, this testimony is evidence that prayer really works.

In all of his honors, Mr. Junior Class, 1st Alternate to Mr. Callaway High School, Mr. Senior Class, he has remained humble and grateful for every opportunity. This gift from God has been a blessing over and over again. Our prayer is that we have shown gratitude in the way we have handled the blessing. ## Welcoming Others Into the House of the Lord

They are there every Sunday morning as we enter the foyer of the sanctuary – greeting us and handing us a program for worship service. They greet us with a warm smile and a friendly “Hello” or “Good morning”. **The In Touch Ministry** - there every Sunday morning to welcome us back to our church home and to make visitors feel at home as they enter the doors of Greater Pearlie Grove. Not all members perform all the duties of the ministry but each are welcome to volunteer for the duty that best fits their desire and availability. Voluntary ministry members choose the Sunday and service they are available to greet. Working together, the In Touch Ministry fulfills the needs of Greater Pearlie Grove while serving God through this ministry. Although a greeter’s love should be no stronger than the love found in the rest of the body of Christ, nevertheless the greeter performs a major role in ensuring that people see and experience that love. - Giving them to a church usher


- Giving them to a youth worker


